Monday 27th: Large Scale Integration – towards 12% penetration in Europe – a reality?

Wind power is on course to become an increasing part of Europe's power mix. EWEA business forecast sees 180GW of wind generating 12% of Europe's total TWh requirements by 2020, and delivering 37% of all new EU generation capacity. The challenges of realising a double digit share of Europe's power needs will be discussed and debated by key players at the front-line of the mainstreaming of wind.

Tuesday 28th: Wind's role in the global energy market

The world's energy mix is undergoing a fundamental shift. The IEA estimates that by 2030 the global power sector needs 4,800GW of new capacity at a cost of €16 trillion. There are various traditional and new options on the table - oil, gas, coal, clean coal, nuclear, and now wind. How does wind fit into the global energy picture?
